## Foggy, Soggy Hoggies: Greenbank Tour Fun

Thanks to Joe Meek KD4FKT (who arranged the tour) and Rick Fisher KE8DH (who conducted the tour), over a dozen hams had a great time at the Greenbank National Radio Observatory Telescope facility in Greenbank, West Virginia.

The group met at the Holiday Inn parking lot north of Staunton at 8 am as planned. After a brief organizational meeting to determine who was riding with whom, the hams hit the road, taking scenic Highway 250 over the mountains into the fog.

Led by an intrepid fearsome foursome atop Harley Hogs (cute crotch rockets), the caravan of curious car-poolers careened towards the complex located close to Cass.

Pausing briefly at the top of Shenandoah Mountain for a group picture (top of opposite page) the line of vehicles stopped again in Monterey for some go-go juice (for the Hogs, for the cars, and for the hams).

Another stop was made west of Hightown to allow the unprotected Hoggy riders to don raingear.

Upon arriving at the antenna complex, the hams took in the very nice visitor center and museum, learning about the radio waves emanating from intra and intergalactic space. After a few minutes in the visitor center, the group was treated to a personally-guided behind-the-scenes tour by Rick, one of the lead scientists at the facility.

Rick showed off the electronics labs, specialty receivers (bottom right) and control room (opposite, middle) and explained the necessity of cooling the receivers to just a few fractions of a degree above absolute zero. He also explained how the facility deals with interference and reflected signals (from aircraft radar reflections to computer hash) to distinguish space signals from terrestrial ones (top right).

Using observatory vehicles, Rick led the group through the restrictive gates out into the telescope field (right center). The group got to see several of the large dish antennas up close and personal, including the "Green Bank Telescope", the 100-meter dish, the largest steerable antenna of its kind in the world (opposite page, top right and next-to-bottom)

After the tour, the hams ate in the employee cafeteria. A hamfest-like convention of astronomy vendors was going on in the basement of the visitor center, treating hams to demonstrations of telescopes, binoculars, and other astronomical observing technology.

Dave noted that he was able to hear Ray "in the clear" as late as 6 pm, long after the usual broadcast QRM normally becomes unbearable on 40 meters. The propagation was quite unusual.
