VARA President's Message

At our last meeting there was some discussion regarding Amateur Radio License Plates. Here is what I got off the DMV website:

AMATEUR RADIO OPERATOR CALL LETTERS PLATE

"A vehicle displaying Call Letter Plates is subject to inspection by DMV or any police officer to determine if the operator and the vehicle comply with the requirements. To display Call Letter Plates you must be an amateur radio operator licensed by the Federal Communications Commission, have operational transmitting and receiving equipment permanently installed in your vehicle, own the vehicle on which your Call Letter Plates are displayed, return your Call Letter Plates to any DMV office to exchange them for regular plates if your equipment is not operating and/or is removed for more than 90 days."

Someone at the meeting had mentioned that any law enforcement agency could remove your plates if you failed to have a working radio in your car. Not having a working radio would void your registration. I have not been able to confirm that statement. I spent some time in a law enforcement rules and regulations book with about a million laws, but did not find it. That does not mean it is not there, it just means I ran out of time to research the issue. In any event, if you have ham plates, you should keep your end of the bargain and have a working radio and antenna permanently mounted in your car.

The downside is we should not rely just on bonus points to get the big score!!!

Conclusion: Get ALL Bonus Points and Make Lots of QSO's - equals BIG Score!

If you have Amateur Radio tags on your vehicle you must have a radio permanently installed that is capable of sending and receiving. A handheld radio is not considered permanently installed. The owner of the vehicle may have to demonstrate ability to send and/or receive. While acknowledging that amateur radio operators offer a valuable service to the Commonwealth, an officer has the discretion to pull the tags immediately if the radio is not permanently installed or is not capable of sending and/or receiving.
